## Japan's ODA: Rolling Plan for the Republic of Fiji

As of April, 2012

## [Diplomatic Consideration, etc.]

1. In line with the Principle of ODA Implementation in Japan's Official Development Assistance Charter, assistance to Fiji is supposed to be limited to the following areas and projects, paying due consideration to the situation in Fiji toward the recovery of democracy process; (1) contributing to the improvement of people's lives such as education, health and support for social vulnerable groups, (2) addressing global issues such as environment and infectious diseases, and (3) addressing common issues of the Pacific Island countries by implementing regional cooperation projects. 2. In order to facilitate democracy in Fiji, dialogues with Fiji will be maintained and strengthened.

The current risk management systems for natural disasters like meteorological information systems are insufficient, and residents' awareness and preparedness are weak to deal with and mitigate the effect of natural disasters. Promoting renewable energy is required not only for mitigating the climate change effects, but also for reducing the quantity of importing oil. 	[Background] University education is not easily accessible in the Pacific Region, especially for small countries without their own university. Distance learning offered by the University of the South Pacific (USP) is a precious educational opportunity in the region through the USP's network system (USPNet), that has been upgraded under the coordination among Australia, New Zealand and Japan. However, the capacity of distance learning in both facilities and management should be further developed, in order to respond to ICT innovation and the growing number of users. Education-related indicators of Fiji such as the school enrollment ratio are relatively favorable.
