

## Japan's ODA: Rolling Plan for the Republic of Fiji

As of April, 2012

【Diplomatic Consideration, etc.】  
 1. In line with the Principle of ODA Implementation in Japan's Official Development Assistance Charter, assistance to Fiji is supposed to be limited to the following areas and projects, paying due consideration to the situation in Fiji toward the recovery of democracy process; (1) contributing to the improvement of people's lives such as education, health and support for social vulnerable groups, (2) addressing global issues such as environment and infectious diseases, and (3) addressing common issues of the Pacific Island countries by implementing regional cooperation projects.  
 2. In order to facilitate democracy in Fiji, dialogues with Fiji will be maintained and strengthened.

【Development Issue】  Environment Conservation	【Background】 In the Pacific region, the amount of waste is increasing due to modern lifestyle depending on imported goods and the present waste disposal system is not functioning appropriately. Waste management is a regional common issue, and some improvements achieved through Japanese cooperation in Samoa and Vanuatu have been introduced into other countries in the region. In the Pacific Island countries, natural environment is an important resource for tourism and other sectors, hence establishing an appropriate waste management system and a sustainable natural resource management system is a critical issue. Furthermore, as a primary industry, fisheries industry requires measures to address resource degradation and sustainable use of resources.				【Japan's Assistance policy】 Coordinating with regional organization such as South Pacific Regional Environment Programme (SPREP), the Ministry of Environment and municipalities in Japan, Japan provides assistance to establish a comprehensive and integrated waste management system and to elaborate regional waste disposal plan. Japan also provides assistance to develop coastal resource management techniques through dispatching JICA experts and volunteers.

	<p>【Background】 In the Pacific region, natural disasters such as earthquakes, tsunamis and cyclones occur frequently, and the damage is expected to become more severe due to the recent climate changes. The current risk management systems for natural disasters like meteorological information systems are insufficient, and residents' awareness and preparedness are weak to deal with and mitigate the effect of natural disasters. Promoting renewable energy is required not only for mitigating the climate change effects, but also for reducing the quantity of importing oil. The Government of Fiji sets the national target of the renewable energy against fossil fuels in on-grid power generation at 90 percent by 2015.</p>			<p>【Japan's Assistance policy】 In consideration of the Pacific Environment Community committed in PALM 5, Japan continues its assistance for disaster risk management and renewable energy under regional cooperation frameworks for the Pacific Islands, taking into account the viewpoint of human security.</p>

<p>【Development Issue】  Improvement of Health and Medical Services</p>	<p>【Background】 Infectious diseases are a common threat in the Pacific region and have been addressed as a priority. To assure sustainability of the immunization programme, human resources should be developed further. The health-related indicators of Fiji such as the infant mortality rate are relatively favorable. On the other hand, the quality of health care and medical services, especially in the remote and rural areas, still have room for improvement.</p>			<p>【Japan's Assistance policy】 In partnership primarily with WHO and UNICEF under the donor coordination framework, Japan continues capacity development for cold chain maintenance and vaccine logistics for the improvement of vaccination coverage. Simultaneously, Japan promotes capacity development of health workers, especially community health nurses in the Pacific region.</p>
