A warm welcome to you all. Today, we have gathered here to sign grant contracts and formalize Japan's assistance to the Lautoka Delana Primary School and Rotary Pacific Water for Life Foundation.

I am very pleased to say that the Government of Japan will be providing;

(1) Eighty-seven thousand US dollars (USD 86,894) to Lautoka Delana Primary Schhol for "The Project for Upgrading of Lautoka Delana Primary School" and ②Fifty-four thousand US dollars (USD 54,067) to Rotary Pacific Water for Life Foundation for "The Project for Water Supply to Vuiyakana (ヴィャカナ) Village and Kavika (カヴィカ) Settlement",

I am happy to update you all that the Government of Japan has supported nine (9) schools with a total funding of Eight Million and Four Hundred Thousand Fijian Dollars (FJ\$8.4m) in 2016 and 2017.

Since 1990, Japan has been providing assistance to grassroots communities in Fiji through 353 GGP projects, with the total value exceeding Twenty Three Million US Dollars (US\$23.64 million).

May I also take this opportunity to kindly urge the distinguished recipient representatives to ensure the timely and successful completion of your respective projects. It is my honour to reaffirm Japan's commitment to providing continued assistance in the Education and Health Sector for the sustainable development of Fiji.

I conclude with confidence that these projects will further strengthen friendship between the people and governments of Japan and Fiji.
