Details of the Project for Provision of Garbage Truck to Betio Town

1. Basis for Implementing the Project

The timely assistance of the garbage truck will boost the Council's solid waste collection operations. Currently, Betio Town Council hires three open trucks to ensure waste collection schedule is aptly covered. However, this option is not economically viable for the Council and it also poses occupational, health and safety risks to the garbage collectors and the general public as well.

The provision of the garbage truck will improve waste management operations of Betio Town Council by providing an efficient, hazard free and timely waste collection service to the residents of Betio.

Details for the Project for Provision of Ambulance to Tungaru Central Hospital

1. Basis for Implementing the Project

The new fully equipped ambulance will be a welcomed addition to the current fleet of ambulances stationed at Tungaru Central Hospital which is the main hospital in Tarawa and receives referrals from sub-division hospitals and health centres. There were only two ambulances that services 56,324 (2015 Census) residents of South Tarawa. On average, calls received through the Emergency/Outpatient Department range from 10-15 in a day. The new ambulance will provide timely and efficient medical services and improve emergency response to those who require immediate medical assistance by providing a safe and reliable transport to medical facilities.
