## Details for The Project for Provision of Livestock breeding Facility for livelihood of Youth Clubs

## 1. Basis for Implementing the Project

The Embassy of Japan provided set of poultry farming facility and equipment to the Holy Spiritual Congregation Youth Club (Vacoko, Naboro) through the Ministry of Youth and Sports. This youth club is registered youth club under the Ministry, Most of the youth members are students or unemployed young people between the ages of 18 and 35.

This project was requested by the Ministry for the improvement of livelihood of communities through the development of youth clubs. Embassy decided to assist them based on our development cooperation policy of supporting Strengthening of the Basis for Economic Growth. In collaboration, the Ministry provided training on livestock management, project management and financial literacy and the new farming facility will not only benefit the youths but it will also be beneficial to the village members as a whole through enhancing their knowledge and skills on material maintenance and farm facility up keeping.

The GGP Programme is part of the overall Japanese ODA implemented by the Embassy of Japan in order to empower the people from the grassroots level. The GGP Programme in Fiji has been widely implemented in areas such as education, water supply, health, transportation, IT, agriculture and fisheries since 1990. To date, 423 projects have been funded under the GGP Programme which amount to an approximate value exceeding USD 32 million.
