### Japan Hands Over A New Water Supply System and an Ablution Block to Nawaisomo Primary School and Navunisea District School

The Government of Japan provided assistance worth up to FJ\$397,127 (US\$199,200) to Habitat for Humanity Fiji for Improvement of Water and Sanitation Environment in Toki Village, Navunisea School, Nawaisomo School through its Grant Assistance for Grassroots Human Security Projects (GGP).

## <u>Details for The Project for Improvement of Water and Sanitation Environment in</u> <u>Toki Village, Navunisea School, Nawaisomo School</u>

### 1. Basis for Implementing the Project

The three targeted community and schools for the Project are Toki Village, Navunisea District School, and Nawaisomo Primary School which share common challenges, such as 1. it's current water source is not being able to satisfy the demand of water 2. continued deterioration of water quality 3. with poor sanitations and unhygienic facilities, they are prone to contracting diseases. The water improvement project in the three respective village and schools is now going to address their water supply woes and sanitation problems.

The new system will not only assist in access to clean water but also provide a better sanitation environment which will help improve their physical well-being, health, as well as enhance the their activities.

#### 2. Basic Information

(a) Donor: Embassy of Japan in Fiji

(b) Recipient: Habitat for Humanity Fiji

(c) Total funding: US\$199,200 (FJ\$397,127)

The GGP Programme is part of the overall Japanese ODA implemented by the Embassy of Japan in order to empower the people from the grassroots level. The GGP Programme in Fiji has been widely implemented in areas such as education, water supply, health, transportation, IT, agriculture and fisheries since 1990. To date, 423 projects have been funded under the GGP Programme which amount to an approximate value exceeding USD 32 million.
