Over the past years, the school roll had increased drastically without the necessary school infrastructure expansion and improvement. Particularly, the deteriorating conditions of old ablution block is not enough to cater the students. Additionally, kindergarten students do not have a dedicated classroom of their own.

For that reason, the Government of Japan funded the construction of a new ablution block and a kindergarten class room with furniture. This facilities will aim improve education and provide a better learning environment for the students.

The project will assist the school in easing the congestion issues currently affecting the school and provide a better learning environment for students and teachers alike. The kindergarten students will also enjoy a new classroom and ablution facilities that is built specifically for younger students.
