The construction of these new facilities directly addresses these challenges. This initiative reflects Japan's continued commitment to supporting Fiji's education sector and aligns perfectly with our Grassroots Grant Assistance Programme (GGP). Since its inception in 1990, the GGP has funded over 423 projects across Fiji, contributing more than US\$32 million to sustainable development.

The successful completion of this project is a testament to the collaborative spirit and dedication of all stakeholders. We are immensely grateful for the invaluable support from the Fijian Government—particularly the Ministries of Education and Public Works—and the tireless efforts of Bau District School's staff and community.
